


Perpetual Interpreter (2019)

"... Perpetual Interpreter invites a group of artists to take a look at the expressive and poetic qualities of computer programming. The artists examine how code affects us—beyond the slick interfaces we have come to expect from software applications—in an attempt to make the realm of coded instructions, programming languages, software protocols, electrical signals and logical operations available to aesthetic experience ..."

Joana Chicau: "A Webpage In Three Acts" (2019)
Joana Chicau performs real-time algorithmic composition as a way to explore processes of becoming structures, languages, codes and scripts. For A Webpage In Three Acts she creates hybrid scores that link choreography with webcoding functions.

Kristoffer Ørum: "Listening Without Ears" (2019)

This a map of what the audience talk about as they look at the works in the show. Based on Google's speech recognition three objects in the exhibition continually transcribe what is said in their proximity.




WUOS, Wrocław Urban Operating System (2019)

WRO Media Art Biennale, Wroclaw, Poland.

The future of the modern city is a computational model—a vast array of vectors extracted from sensors and networked devices inside the city. This future resides in a technological grammar of data, services, protocols, applications and monitoring systems, that constitute a so called smart city ...

The Wrocław Urban Operating System takes an interest in the city as computational model. It compiles various digital representations of the city— audio recordings, photos, video and smart city narratives — and utilizes these in a live coding framework, built specifically for this work, to produce an ambient pop music that corresponds with the computational configuration and teletopia of a future Wrocław.

OUOS, Oslo Urban Operating System (2018) Shown @ BOA, Oslo, Sept-Oct 2018

The Oslo Urban Operating System is an oraculous bot that spawns new futures for the city of Oslo.

Press, extract: "... The vision of the smart city, and the implementation of smart city technologies, differ significantly: The vision is a techno-centric, transparent and open city development plan, that helps policy makers rethink and rebuild city services and structures in accordance with citizens needs. The reality of the smart city is a lot messier: The implementation of smart technologies means aggregation of data into black boxes, opaque and elusive, satisfying entirely other needs than those of the citizen.."





OUOS, Oslo Urban Operating System (2018)

Left: A single name of an Oslo resident, iterated over by graphical state machine (Langtons Ant). Right: the OUOS digestive system processing all the Oslo related information scraped from various archives and stored in the OUOS API.

The particles in the interface represents information entities, such as resident names, addresses, public institutions, roads etc. Some of the entities are absorbed into the system while passing through the screen. These entities are then used in the construction of new potential futures for Oslo.
